HISTORY OF THE CASE

The Complaint petition filed by the consumer Shri Dusa Kumbhar who is a LT-Dom. consumer availing a CD of 1 KW. He was disputed the average bills raised from Jan-2015 to Oct-2019 & Sep-2021 to Jan-2024 for defective meter. He was submitted his grievances for revision of bill. The complainant needs suitable bill revision for the said period.

The case was heard in detail.

PROCEEDING OF HEARING DATED: 04.09.2024

SUBMISSION OF COMPLAINANT DURING HEARING

The complainant is a consumer under Belgaon section of Saintala Sub-division. The consumer represented that he has received energy bill with defective meter from Jan-2015 to Oct-2019 & Sep-2021 to Jan.-2024. For that, the arrear has been accumulated to ₹29,666.78p upto Jul.-2024. The complainant raised dispute against the said period and requested before the Forum for suitable revision of the bill.

SUBMISSION OF OPPOSITE PARTY DURING HEARING

The OP appeared before the Forum with relevant record. On defence, he intimated that the consumer is a LT-Dom. consumer availing power supply since Mar.-2012. The billing dispute raised by the complainant for the average billing from Jan-2015 to Oct-2019 was due to meter defective. A new meter with sl. no. LW412027 was installed during on 11th Nov. 2019, thereafter actual billing was done. As the above-stated period bill has not been revised, it needs bill revision.

Secondly, the billing dispute raised by the complainant for the average billing from Sep-2021 to Jan.-2024. A new meter with sl. no. TWB319483 has been installed during on 28th Feb. 2024, thereafter actual billing has been done. As the above-stated period bill has not been revised, it needs bill revision.

Considering the above, the OP requested before the Forum for revision of previous disputed bills and pass order as deemed fit.

FINDINGS AND ANALYSIS OF THE FORUM

The consumer is a LT-Dom. consumer with a CD of 1 KW. The consumer has availed power supply since 17th Mar. 2012 and the arrear outstanding upto Jul.-2024 is ₹ 29,666.78p. As complained by the complainant and submission of OP, it is observed by the Forum that,

1. Due to meter defective, the consumer was served with average bills from Jan-2015 to Oct-2019 with meter no. 2036869 resulting accumulation of arrear outstanding. A new meter was installed by OP with meter no. LW412027 on 11th Nov. 2019, thereafter actual billing was done. In the instant case, it is surprised that the OP has allowed the consumer to continue with defective meter for more than four years. In the above case, due to delay in installation of new meter, average billing was done which could have been avoided if the OP has installed the meter without delay for which it is advised to the OP to take some pro-active measure for early replacement of defective meter.

On scrutiny of the documents, it is observed by the Forum that the bills raised during meter defective period needs bill revision under Cl-155 & 157 of OERC Dist. (Conditions of Supply) Code 2019 to redress the consumer grievances. However, during the course of hearing, the OP has admitted with the billing complaints and initiated bill revision process on the spot observing departmental guidelines. Accordingly, the monthly bill has been recalculated with the consumption and an amount of ₹ 15,572.03p is to be withdrawn from the arrear outstanding.

2. As represented by the consumer, due to meter defective, he was served with average bills from Sep.-2021 to Jan.-2024 with meter no. LW412027 which was installed on 11th Nov. 2019 which needs bill revision. The OP admitted the complaint and submitted that against the defective meter, a new meter has been installed with meter no. TWB319483 on 28th Feb. 2024 and thereafter actual billing is going on. The defective billing period needs bill revision as per consumption of new meter.

In the instant case, it is surprised that the OP has allowed the consumer to continue with defective meter for more than two years. Due to delay in installation of new meter, average billing was done which could have been avoided if the OP has installed the meter without delay for which it is advised to the OP to be taken care in future.

On scrutiny of the documents, it is observed by the Forum that the bills raised during meter defective period needs bill revision under Cl-155 & 157 of OERC Distribution Code-2019 to redress the consumer grievances.

3. The complainant has not paid the monthly bill regularly for which the arrear has been accumulated to ₹29,666.78p upto Jul.-2024.

In view of above facts and circumstances and after going through the documents submitted by both the parties, the Forum pronounces the following order as per regulations of the OERC Distribution (Conditions of Supply) Code'2019.

- 1. The OP has re-calculated the bill for the period Jan-2015 to Oct-2019 and the petitioner was convinced with the proposed withdrawal amount of ₹ 15,572.03p. Hence, the Forum directed the OP to carry-out the revision proposal and must be reflected in the next bill.
- 2. A) The energy bills raised to the consumer from Sep-2021 to Jan-2024 are to be revised for the period Mar-2022 to Feb-2024 (restricted to two year) as per succeeding six months average consumption of new meter by considering IMR: 0 (28.02.2024) & FMR of Aug.-2024 under Cl-155 & 157 of OERC Distribution Code 2019.
 - B) DPS is to be levied as per OERC Regulation.
 - C) All sundries and adjustments are to be considered during the above revision period.

Case is disposed off accordingly.

Compliance report must be submitted to the Forum by the opposite party within one month after receipt of GRF order otherwise it will be treated as non-compliance.
