HISTORY OF THE CASE

The Complainant is a LT-Dom. consumer availing a CD of 2 KW. He has disputed about the average bills raised from Jan-Feb/2008 to Sep-2015 due to meter defective. He has submitted his grievances for revision of bill. The complainant needs suitable bill revision for the said period.

The case was heard in detail.

PROCEEDING OF HEARING DATED : 19.03.2024

SUBMISSION OF COMPLAINANT DURING HEARING

The complainant is a consumer under Cherupali section of Binka Sub-division. The consumer represented that he was served with average bills due to meter defective from Jan-Feb/2008 to Sep-2015. For that average bills, the arrear has accumulated to ₹. 1,11,742.09p upto Feb.-2024. The complainant raised dispute against the said period and requested before the Forum for suitable revision of bill.

SUBMISSION OF OPPOSITE PARTY DURING HEARING

The OP appeared before the Forum without relevant documents. On defence, he intimated that the consumer is a LT-Dom consumer availing power supply sine Oct-2003. The billing dispute raised by the complainant for the average billing from Jan-Feb/2008 to Sep-2015 was due to meter defective for that period. A new meter with sl. no. WES04280 has been installed during Oct-2015, thereafter actual billing was done. As the above-stated average billing period bill has not been revised, it needs bill revision.

Considering the above, the OP requested before the Forum for revision of previous disputed bills and pass order as deemed fit.

FINDINGS AND ANALYSIS OF THE FORUM

The consumer is a LT-Dom. consumer with a CD of 2 KW. The consumer has availed power supply since 15th Oct. 2003 and the arrear outstanding upto Feb.-2024 is ₹. 1,11,742.09p. As complained by the complainant and submission of OP, it is observed by the Forum that,

1. Due to meter defective with meter no. 048494, the consumer was served with average bills from Jan-Feb/2008 to Sep-2015 resulting accumulation of arrear outstanding.
2. A new meter has been installed by OP with meter no. WES04280 during Oct-2015. Thereafter actual billing was done. In the instant case, it is surprised that the OP has allowed the consumer to continue with defective meter for more than seven years. Due to delay in installation of new meter, average billing was done which could have been avoided if the OP has installed the meter without delay for which it is advised to the OP to be taken care in future.
3. The complainant has not paid the monthly bill regularly for which the arrear has accumulated to ₹. 1,11,742.09p upto Feb.-2024.
4. The OP has submitted that as the disputed bills has not yet revised, it needs bill revision as per consumption of new meter.


On scrutiny of the documents, it is observed by the Forum that the bills raised during meter defective period needs bill revision under Cl-155 & 157 of OERC Dist. (Conditions of Supply) Code 2019 to redress the consumer grievances. However, during the course of hearing, the OP has agreed with the billing complaints and initiate bill revision process on the spot observing departmental guidelines. Accordingly, the monthly bill has recalculated with the consumption and an amount of ₹. 36,666.77p is to be withdrawn from the arrear outstanding.


In view of above facts and circumstances and after going through the documents submitted by both the parties, the Forum pronounces the following order as per regulations of the OERC Distribution (Conditions of Supply) Code 2019.

The OP has re-calculated the bill and the petitioner was convinced with the proposed withdrawal amount of ₹. 36,666.77p. Hence, the Forum directed the OP to carry-out the revision proposal which must be reflected in the next bill.

Case is disposed off accordingly.

Compliance report must be submitted to the Forum by the opposite party within one month after receipt of GRF order otherwise it will be treated as non-compliance.
